Statement of Facts	Personal injury lawsuit for damages for soft-tissue complaints to back, neck, shoulders, and left foot arising from a 12/20/12 MVA. Plaintiff was a belted front seat passenger in a vehicle t-boned on the driver's side at a surface street intersection, and tipped up on the passenger side as a result of the collision. Plaintiff claimed the accident "changed his life" and resulted in soft tissue injuries and plantar fascitis to his left foot. Defendant Bustillos disappeared from sight months before trial and could never be located. The court ruled she was solely at fault for the accident and the case went to trial on medical causation and damages issues, only. After less than three hours, the jury concluded that the accident did not cause the plaintiff's complaints. Plaintiff asked for about \$63,000 in damages.
